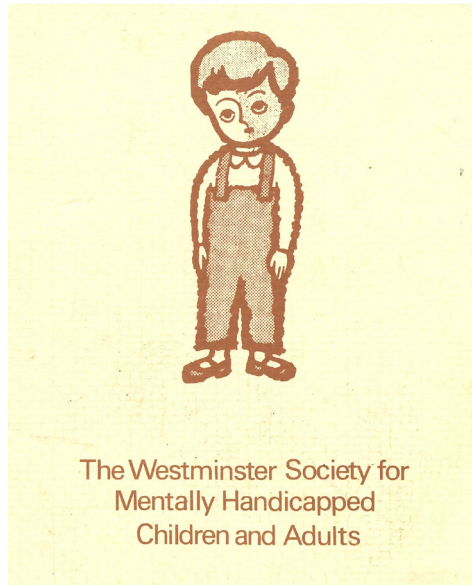


LDN London Logo and Name Development 1962-2022

Our first logo from 1962 when we first started called 'The Paddington and St Marylebone Society for Mentally Handicapped Children', which then changed to 'The Westminster Society for Mentally Handicapped Children' and later to 'The Westminster Society for Mentally Handicapped Children and Adults' as the children we supported grew up.

This first logo was a drawing of Steven Mullins, the son of one of our founder members Violet Mullins.

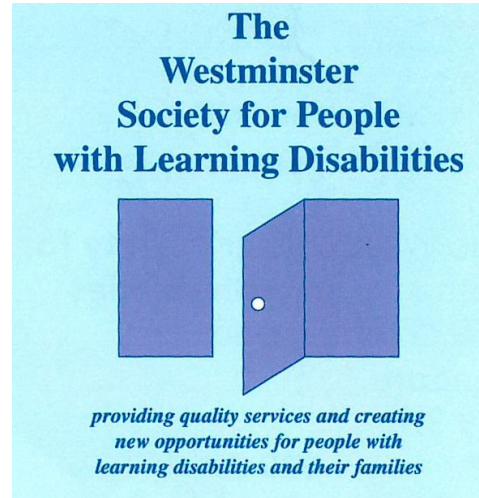
